## **VET4NAI PROJECT** Duration: February 2022 - January 2025

VET for NAI is an ambitious Erasmus+ project that aims at the rapid and effective integration of newly arrived immigrants (NAIs) into the labour market through training that integrates familiarisation with the language of the host country and offers skills.

This will increase their accessibility to European labour markets and will foster their inclusion into their host countries' societies.

The Guidance Toolkit will be based on empowering newly arrived immigrants, focusing on active choice on their entrance into the labour market.

### VET4NAI project aims to research current national obstacles in an effective integration of newly arrived immigrants into the labour market and its needs, and on the basis of that develop a career guidance toolkit.

#### Project Progress: December 2023 - December 2024

Since the Vet4Nai project is coming to an end, all project deliverables are being accurately refined and finalised.

As for the PR3, partners successfully finalised the **Training Handbook**, representing the culmination of our joint efforts to promote personal and career development through structured training initiatives. Crafted across six distinct modules, each module represents a collaborative effort between our partnering organizations, ensuring a diverse range of perspectives and expertise.

Moving forward, the **piloting phase** of the training program conducted within PR4 was critical in validating the results achieved. With a combination of online and face-to-face sessions across multiple countries, we managed to create a dynamic learning environment that fosters collaboration, engagement, and skill development among participants. All project outputs were tested with professionals in the field of migrants' professional integration to ensure the effectiveness of the project results.

## Last Transnational Partners Meeting

The Vet4Nai project partners met for the last time on 14th and 15th november 2024 in Stockholm, Sweden, hosted by the project coordinator Trim Tab. The meeting was a good occasion to reflect about the project achievements and discuss how to ensure their sustainability over time



# **Multiplier events**

In December 2024, the Vet4Nai project successfully hosted a series of multiplier events across all partner countries, marking a significant milestone in its ongoing efforts to promote innovation and collaborative practices for integrating newsly arrived migrants in the European labour market.





# **Piloting sessions**

The piloting sessions in the four partnership countries - Sweden, Greece, Italy and France were conducted **online** and engaged several participants from **diverse professional backgrounds**, including educators, counselors, managers, and psychosocial professionals.

The sessions introduced the VET4NAI toolkit components - **the handbook, digital quiz, and card game** - and explored their practical application in vocational guidance for newly arrived immigrants.

Overall, participants provided positive feedback, highlighting the toolkit relevance and its **great practical application** in different professional contexts. The satisfaction surveys revealed **high levels of engagement**, with participants agreeing that the sessions met their expectations. They particularly appreciated the **interactive elements** of the Vet4Nai training tools, such as the card game, which made the learning process dynamic and effective.

**Minor recommendations** for improvement included simplifying instructions and enhancing the interactivity of the online platform to ensure a smoother user experience.

Overall, the pilot demonstrated the toolkit strong potential to **support the vocational integration of newly arrived immigrants**, thus effectively contributing to reach the project goals.
